

Her education background includes 26 years as an administrator, a special education specialist and a teacher in the classroom.

Following her 1990 graduation from the University of Dayton in Dayton, Ohio where she received a Bachelor's degree in Elementary Education with a specialization in Learning Disabilities, Melissa taught at Talala Elementary School in Park Forest, IL. From 1992 to 2007 Melissa was a special education resource teacher at Infant Jesus of Prague School in Flossmor, IL. In 2013 a family move to Michigan landed Melissa at Guardian Angels Catholic School in Clawson, Michigan as the principal of the school. She has been in that position until now, when the family decided to come back home to Illinois.

They are both firm believers in Catholic education. Andrew and Melissa attended Catholic School from First Grade through and including college (Melissa actually graduated from St. Liborius right here in the Diocese of Joliet).
